This was quite an interesting talk and many of us learned how to really find out what the weather conditions are going to be in the near future. For example, he predicted El Niño and it is behaving just as it should be.


And, 2016 looks good too. We had our first Cruising Club meeting on Tuesday, 12 January. At this meeting, we learned a great deal about emergency preparedness from David Potter. David is the former Fire Chief for Monterey and now serves as the Monterey Fire Department's Emergency Services Coordinator. David gave a very informative and energetic talk about safety and emergency preparedness, focusing on weather and climate events (i.e. El Niño), fires, but also storms, waves, beach conditions, and other land-sea interactions that would obviously face and concern sailors of MPYC. He passed out some great handouts aimed at helping folks become better prepared for emergencies. David strongly suggested that everyone sign up and register their phones (both line and cell) with Alert Monterey County (alertmontereycounty.org). We discussed the cruise schedule for 2016, which is still mostly tentative. which will be on 10-11 September, 2016. The other cruises are to be scheduled at future meetings.

We also discussed the potluck/meeting schedule for 2016. We will once again be meeting on the second Tuesday of each month at MPYC. These usually start with members arriving a bit before 6:00 pm, setting up their potluck dishes, having a beverage, and then eating. Usually by 7:00 pm or so, we start our meeting, followed by the speaker for the evening. So far, we have three speakers scheduled for the next three months.

On 9 February, we will hear from Sally-Christine Rodgers on her book Convergence: A Voyage Through French Polynesia. Sally-Christine has given presentations at several other yacht clubs, who described it as "reliving an amazing blue-water sailing odyssey." The journey (and book) were inspired by her father's tales of 1930s Polynesia, retracing his wanderings while exploring the essence of South Pacific island life and culture, and what has changed over time. The book and presentation will feature Sally-Christine's photography and what has been called "often poetic travel adventure poetry." She also will describe the challenges of family cruising. Sally was joined on the voyage, and will be accompanied at MPYC, by her husband Randy Repass, founder of the well-known chandlery, West Marine.
